



#### Donor Pledges and Estate Notes

A **Donor Pledge** is a promise of a future gift. The donor promises to give a certain amount over a set amount of time. Think of it as an IOU.

- \$5,000 in 2024
- \$200 per month for five years
- \$50,000 Payable on Death (POD)

**Estate Notes** are irrevocable pledges from a donor's estate. The Estate Note Value is reduced by payments BAC received for the pledge during the donor's life. The Estate Note is a debt to the estate and deducted before determining the donor's Adjusted Gross Estate.

Express your intention to donate to the BAC directly. We will provide you with the Pledge Form and necessary guidance on how to proceed.
