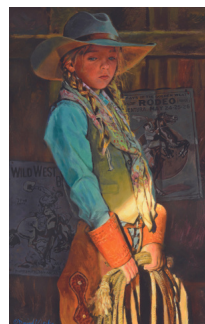

39th Annual Bosque Art Classic

The BAC Art Council will premiere its 39th Annual Bosque Art Classic with a sale and awards dinner on Saturday, September 14. The juried representational art exhibition is widely known for the variety of quality work it draws from across the nation.

Cowboy Artist of America member Martin Grelle served as juror/judge for this year's show, which features exquisite still lifes, landscapes, portraits, and more, in addition to the western art for which it is renowned. Over \$15,000 will be awarded opening night to deserving artists, including the \$5,000 John Steven Jones Purchase Award, which marks its 35th anniversary this year.

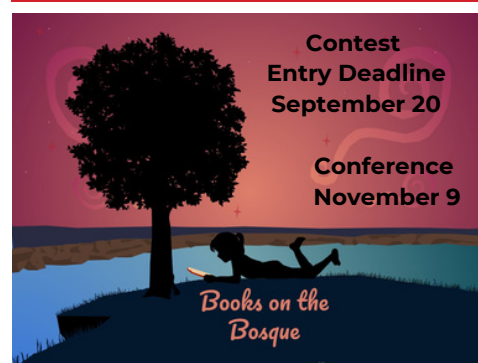

Deadline for entering the **Texas Troubadour Songwriter Classic** is **August 20**. Entry fees are \$15 per song and \$15 to be considered for the Songwriter Classic live event in October.

The two-part contest is open to country music songwriters and singer/songwriters with **\$3000** in awards available:

\$1000 for the Song of the Year based on digital entries, and **\$1500 and \$500** in awards at the live event. Visit our website for details.

Former Statler Brother Jimmy Fortune to Headline Troubadour

We are delighted to have **Jimmy Fortune** of the **Statler Brothers** as headliner and judge for the 2024 Texas Troubadour.

After judging the finalists in the live Troubadour event on **October 26**, Fortune will perform a concert with his band to close out the evening.



Joining the Statler Brothers first as a temporary replacement for tenor Lew DeWitt, Fortune became a permanent member of the group in August of 1982 when DeWitt's health forced him to retire. Fortune quickly made his presence felt, penning number one hits for the group such as **"Elizabeth"** and **"My Only Love."**

In the years since the Statler Brothers retired in 2002, Jimmy has been busy with a solo career, releasing country, Christmas, and gospel CDs. Most recently, he teamed up with the Gaither

Music Group for a Hits and Hymns CD in 2015 and in 2019 his *God and Country* CD and DVD which won a Dove Award in 2020 for Country/Gospel/Roots Album of the Year. Later that year, Fortune joined friends Ben Isaacs, Mike Rogers and Bradley Walker to release the quartet offering *Brotherly Love*.

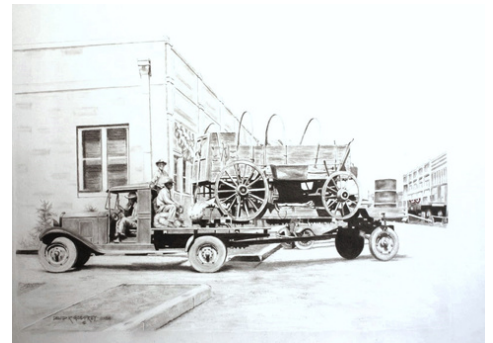

2024 Writing Contest Entry Deadline - SEPTEMBER 20



The 3rd Annual Books on the Bosque Writing Contest will feature **two divisions** this year: an open division for entries from **adults** and a second division for **high school** ages. Entry deadline is September 20.

Categories: (1) Short Story--Short fiction with traditional literary elements; (2) Narrative Nonfiction Essay--Factual piece written in creative, engaging, narrative style; (3) Poetry, Rhymed/Unrhymed-- Verse that observes the more traditional poetry conventions OR or free verse style not bound by rhyme scheme, meter, etc. See guidelines for full submission details.

Last year, cash prizes totaled \$3,000. Total cash prizes for each division soon to be announced.

An award-winning poet, songwriter, and novelist, Tony Burnett has had work published in over 40 international literary magazines including *Short Story America*, *Midwest Review*, and *Equinox*. He has served as board president of the Writer's League of Texas and is currently the managing editor and CEO of Kallisto Gaia Press. His publications include a short story collection, *Southern Gentleman*, a book of poetry titled *The Reckless Hope of Scoundrels*, and his most recent novel, *Watermelon Tattoo*, winner of the Water Tower Press Novel Prize. Tony will enlighten us with an interactive workshop entitled "Aerobic Plot Development."

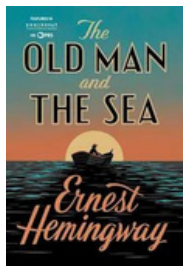


Join us in August, when Jan Beavers and Judy Parton will present Adding Texture and Special Effects to Acrylic Painting.

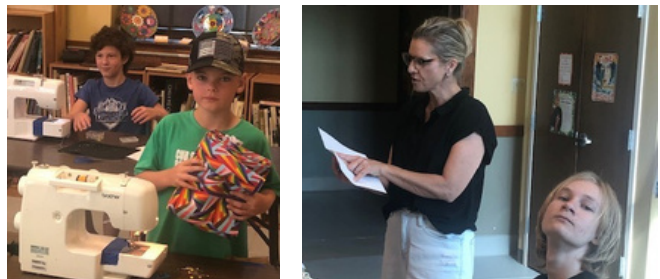
