HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Award: The Bosque Arts Center will award scholarships to graduating seniors from a high school or home school in Bosque County attending a college, university or technical school. Scholarship categories are designated for a prospective major in studio arts (painting, graphic arts, architecture, interior design, advertising art, photography, et al), performing arts (vocal, instrumental music, theatre, dance, et al) and the Humanities. The Scholarship Committee will also consider applications from students who have actively participated in activities at the Bosque Arts Center, but do not have a specific field of study planned.

Eligibility: Student must be a graduating senior who is chosen to receive the award by the Bosque Arts Center scholarship committee based on review of completed application form. Payment will be made directly to the college, university, or technical school where the student has been accepted and is to enroll, and can be applied to tuition, books, fees, or room/board at the discretion of the student. The scholarship recipients must remain enrolled for at least one full semester (or quarter), or the award must be returned to the Arts Center.

Application Procedures:

Recipient will be selected on a basis of combined need and merit. The central office at each high school will be asked to certify the student's grades and rankings. All decisions of the Bosque Arts Center are final. In the event that a scholarship is returned or not used by a successful applicant, the money can be awarded to an alternate candidate, or retained for use in future years.

Selection Criteria: To be selected, a student must:

- Have a high school grade average of 80 or above. The student's grade average for all work completed through the middle of the senior year will be included.
- Be of exemplary character and community standing.
- Receive the recommendations of three persons in Bosque County.
- Complete the required application forms, including preparation of a short essay concerning the student's plans and goals.

Schedule: Application deadline is **May 1, 2026**.
