Radney Foster

Radney Foster returns to the Bosque Arts Center on Saturday, January 18, 2025. The Texas-born country singer/songwriter is known for his solo hits “Angel Flight,” “Nobody Wins,” and “Just Call Me Lonesome.” As part of the duo Foster & Lloyd, he co-wrote the number one hit “Crazy Over You” and the top 10 song “What Do You Want from Me This Time?” His critically acclaimed debut solo album, *Del Rio, TX 1959*, produced four top 40 hits.

Altogether, Foster’s songs have sold 50 million copies worldwide, between his own releases and those recorded by other artists (Keith Urban, Brooks and Dunn, Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, Hootie & The Blowfish, Kenny Loggins, and Los Lonely Boys).

Doors will open at 5:30, with Foster taking the stage at 7 p.m. Logan Mac will open for Foster at 6:30.

Quilts of Valor

Veterans Day saw several honored by Debbie Stubbs and the Quilt Guild with Quilts of Valor. BAC Board member Al Poteet received one at a ceremony at the BAC, while Stubbs presented 100-year-old Mary Ellen Boren hers in her room at Lutheran Sunset.

Al Poteet served two deployments to the Republic of Vietnam as an attack helicopter pilot with the Air Cav in both the 1st Aviation Brigade and 82nd Airborne. He was awarded Air Medal for Valor, the Bronze Star for Valor (ground action), and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Bronze Star. In World War II, Mary Ellen Boren served in the Women's Army Corp at Hamilton Field near San Diego. She ran the Link Trainer, the flight simulator which taught pilots to fly. She loved aeronautics so much she even rode along with search and rescue training missions. Later, she became a stewardess with MidContinent Airlines.~DE
