At one point, to get involved with the local art center, she accepted an invitation to an "art" meeting which turned out to be a weaving guild and admits she was hooked. "Weaving seemed to choose me," says Montgomery.

Montgomery's display will provide a varied collection of her paintings, weaving and poetry. She states that the poetry grew out of her painting and the emotion leftover after completing her painting. She is a prolific artist starting her professional career at the age of 40.
