Intro to Sculpting Workshop

Jeff Gottfried, assistant to Cowboy Artists of America member Bruce Greene, and a past award winner in the Bosque Art Classic, uses his 25 years of sculpting experience and his skills as a professional educator to share his passion for the 3-dimensional form.



In this 2-day workshop, students will sculpt a 1/2-lifesized human bust. Through demonstrations, lectures, and class activities, students will learn basic sculpture techniques: clay manipulation, tools, armature, measuring techniques, and anatomy. An additional focus will be how to look at and appreciate sculpture in general. Students will learn to identify a sculpture's expression of idea,

what makes a compelling design, and effective sculpture display.

From sculpting techniques to appreciation of form, Jeff will guide students through the basics and unlock the wonderful world of sculpture!




Books on the Bosque Writing Contest
