

A Bit About Martin Grelle

Martin Grelle has been making his mark on the world of Western art for half a century. As a prodigious teenager, he was mentored by Cowboy Artists of America member James Boren; within a year of graduating high school, Martin exhibited in his first one man show. In the time since he has accumulated numerous honors, including the Briscoe Museum's Legacy Award for his impact on the world of western art and the Booth Museum's Artist of Excellence Award. He is a three-time winner of the Prix de West Buyers' Choice Award. He was invited into membership with the Cowboy Artists of America in 1995 and has distinguished himself in CAA shows time and time again, winning the Ray Swanson Award and multiple Buyers' Choice awards. Most recently, Martin won the 2023 Gold Medal Oil for *Apsaalooke Storm Racers.~DE*




Art Club
