

In 2025, the mighty Kennebec still freezes, and townspeople and brave tourists huddle inside the pubs for a bit of warmth. In this unique setting, it is not hard to imagine the opening scenes of November's book selection, The Frozen River by Ariel Lawhon. Set in 1789, the fictional story is based on the life of midwife Martha Ballard who is drawn into the aftermath of the shocking discovery of a body found beneath the frozen river's surface. In this finely crafted novel, the setting is as intriguing as the characters, and the detailed descriptions of the time, place and customs of 1789 quickly draw the reader into the harsh Maine winter, and the harsher reality of crime, cover-up, retribution, and resolution. 
