

Teagarden (Hallmark), Midnight Texas (NBC 2017-18), and the Sookie Stackhouse Southern Vampire Series (HBO's True Blood 2009-14).

For anyone interested in books for young ones or in writing for children, we have K.D. Huxman of Colorado Springs joining us. Her second picture book, *Grizzelda Gorilla*, won an EPPY for Best Children's/YA Ebook. Huxman also writes non-fiction for children.

The Art Council's 38th Annual Bosque Art Classic drew over 700 entries from artists across the nation, with ultimately 200 pieces from 124 artists hanging in September's exhibition. Seth Hopkins

of the Booth Western Art Museum in Cartersville, GA, served as juror/judge for the show.

Opening night of the Classic drew a capacity crowd of 300 guests. As Art Council president Virginia Richards pointed out, the show was the "hottest ticket in town."

Patrick Saunders of San Antonio received the 2023 John Steven Jones Purchase Award for Icon. Kathleen Sharp, daughter of award sponsors Roland and Joyce Jones, presented Saunders with the award on behalf of her parents. Sharp



thanked everyone for the expressions of gratitude toward the Jones she'd heard throughout the night. Crystal



Orlando of Moody took home the Art Patrons Purchase Award and Gold Medal Drawing for Wherever I May Roam. Both pieces become a part of the permanent collection in the Jones Gallerv.

The number of pieces sold opening

night was 48, with 12 more being added to that during the show's run for a total of 60.

## ATRIUM GALLERY SUSAN STEPHENS



Our October artist is area resident and pottery guild member, Susan Stephens.

After moving to Lake Whitney in 1992, she taught art in grades K through 12 in Clifton, China Spring and Bosqueville.

As an artist, she primarily works by hand-building using clay slab but throws on the potter's wheel for a change of pace. Organic shapes in the environment inspire the forms and the designs she puts in each piece. Her pottery shows a love of texture using elements from nature, stamps, lace, doilies, or many other textural elements. According to Stephens, glaze colors are a constant experiment with an everchanging and often surprising result.

Susan's pottery will be on display in the Atrium Gallery daily 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and other times during special events.
