Texas Troubadour Songwriter Classic



Candace will be hosting an artist's reception on Thursday, October 10, from 5:00 to 7:00. The public is invited to attend.


Lisa Wingate Luncheon

39th Annual Bosque Art Classic



At the 39th annual Classic, Art Council president Karen Cornett told the artists they were in "rarified air," having been juried in by Martin Grelle out of 678 total entries. Opening night saw Lee Alban of Havre de Grace, MD, take home the John Steven Jones

Purchase Award with his oil *How the West Was Won*, while Eileen Nistler of Upton, WY, won the Art Patrons Purchase Award and Gold Medal Drawing with *End of the Season*. The two pieces become a part of the BAC permanent collection.

Art of the West magazine sponsored a new award in this

year's show, the Artist Choice Award. All artists present were able to vote. Lisa Staudohar of *AotW* announced David Yorke of Clermont, FL, as winner for his oil "Rodeo Dreams."



The Art Council also paid homage to individuals who have been significant in the growth of the show: Roland and Joyce Jones and Mary Ellen Boren. This September, Mary



Ellen celebrated her 100th birthday, while Roland and Joyce marked their 71st wedding anniversary. The Joneses were also hailed for the 35th anniversary of their



funding the Jones Memorial Gallery and the Jones Award, as well as for all the years they sponsored and worked on the Art Classic itself.

Kathleen Sharp, daughter of the couple, assisted in honoring her parents and conveying their gratitude to all, then turned the mic over to Cowboy Artists of America member Bruce Greene, who gave a moving tribute.


"Over the years, the impact that Roland and Joyce Jones have had on our family, our life, is immeasurable," he said, detailing the ways the couple helped financially by purchasing his art, even going so far as to outfit his wife, Janie, for a CAA event in his early days with the group. "This

couple helped raise our kids. They helped us make it."

He closed his speech with the announcement of a life-sized sculpture Roland and Joyce commissioned, *Goats in the Garden*. The piece will exhibit at the CAA show this fall and one will be installed at the front of the BAC, lovingly donated by Roland and Joyce.

"Some people make a difference," Greene said.


Attendees used many hues to create Multi colored Mesa paintings Thank you, Cheryl! The October Art Club program is TBA, but the program chair is hoping
