

The 36th Annual Bosque Art Classic

The 36th Annual Bosque Art Classic saw 185 pieces juried into the exhibition out of the close to 600 entries. The Art Council celebrated the Artists and Award winners on Saturday, September 11, with the Awards ceremony, dinner and opening sales of the art. The exhibition is open free to the public September 12-25.

Tyler Crow, CA served as this year's judge. There were over 100 artists represented this year in the Art Classic. Returning to the show this year were 2020 award winners Joe Barbieri, Linda Becker, Tatsiana Harbacheuskaya, Steve Dunn, Eileen Nistler, and Hebe Brooks. In addition, veterans to the show; Daniel Anz, Kathy Tate, Lloyd Voges, Jean Olliver, and Victor Blakey were present. Several newcomers joined the herd as award winners: Dana Lombardo and Thomas Tankersley. Over half of the winning artists were able to attend this year's Friday night Art Patrons reception and Saturday's Awards ceremony and dinner.

Saturday night was kicked off with the first hour opened up for the Art Patrons to purchase art, followed up with all attendees having the opportunity to purchase through the rest of the evening. Opening night resulted in over 35 pieces of art sold. There was a festive mood for the 270 attendees Saturday evening. Many voiced the pleasure of having the Art Classic "live" again this year after last year's virtual exhibition and sale. The TBT auditorium was outfitted with black table cloths, beautiful Hydrangea centerpieces and brilliant teal napkins with some bling. Dinner was catered by Bestyett from Waco. A big "THANK YOU" to all who made this evening so special after such a challenging year.


Mary Orbeck and Wilfred Beck
