40th BOSQUE ART CLASSIC

The 40th Annual Bosque Art Classic opens its doors Saturday, September 13, at 6:30 p.m. with the sale, dinner, and awards ceremony. After dinner the Art Council will recognize the winning artists, handing out the \$15,500 in awards, including the \$5,000 John Steven Jones Award.

The show consists of 229 works of art, juried by Cowboy Artists of America member Bruce Greene. Among the 130 artists in the show are past award winners Eileen Nistler, Richie Vios, Kathy LeJeune, Kathy Tate, and Ronnie Zint. Others returning to the show include Calvin Carter, Trish Stevenson, Marie Gray, and Wesley Dallas Merritt. Area artists accepted include George Boutwell, Lloyd Voges, Steven Umbach, Judy Parton, and Jan Beavers. This year the Classic welcomes newcomers JD Cole, Elaine Haake, and Aaron Lade.

Reservations are needed by September 5th for the opening ceremony on the 13th. Tickets are \$75 and available online or by calling the BAC. The free exhibition will be open to the public September 14-27, with the online sale running September 15-27.

BAC Art Patron members enjoy the private reception on Friday, along with pre-sale opportunities on Saturday. It's not too late to join—call or go online today.~DE








TAEKWONDO

Master Catherine Wilkinson, the Taekwondo instructor at the BAC, has officially earned her title as a GTMA Taekwondo Master. The Master's Ceremony took place on July 23, 2025, at the iconic H.U. Lee International Garden in Little Rock, AR.

Master Wilkinson was inducted as a member of the GTMA's 2025 Bonghwang Master Class. Each newly inducted GTMA Master is honored with a specially commissioned sword – the "Muduck Sunbee Sword." This sword is crafted in An Dong, Korea by Grand Master GK Lee's personal Swordsmith, Master Swordsmith Eham. Each sword takes 4 months from start to finish. It is a symbol of mastery and an esteemed part of the GTMA Mastership tradition.

Taekwondo classes are underway on Mondays, Thursdays and Fridays at the BAC, taught by Master Catherine Wilkinson. There are several different classes offered: by age, by level of experience and a family class. She has trained in Taekwondo since the year 2000. She is a 6th degree black belt, Master, and qualified instructor with Global Traditional Martial Arts (GTMA). She has been teaching Taekwondo at the BAC since 2023.
