


"Laugh Out Loud" Ladies Luncheon

2024 Writing Contest Entry Deadline - SEPTEMBER 20



Deadline for entering Books on the Bosque's 3rd Annual Writing Contest is Friday, September 20, at 5 p.m. This year's competition features an added division for high school students (public, private, or home-school).

Work will be accepted in the categories of short story, narrative nonfiction essay, and poetry

(rhymed/unrhymed). Cash prizes of \$300, \$200, & \$100 will go to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in each category of the open division. High school prizes will be awarded across prose (short story and essay) and poetry categories.

Once again, Roland and Joyce Jones are sponsoring the **\$1,000 Jones Best of the West Award** in the open division. The award will go to the most original work in any category that pays homage to the values of faith, hard work, and perseverance—*the Spirit of the West* exemplified in the pioneer days through modern-day ranchers and farmers.

We are also working on a workshop with Linda Lucus Hardy. Her work is amazing. See the workshop article for details. ~*KC & DE*



Pottery Guild

The "Rabbit Hole" of Glazing Techniques

As we know, one of the most valuable benefits of being a member of the Pottery Guild is the studio use of our glazes. We carefully mix and maintain a variety of beautiful colors which enhance the pieces that we make.



Recently, Susan Stephens has taken a "deep dive" into the study of one particular glazing technique known as Mocha Diffusion. This involves mocha tea (a mixture of an acid such as lemon juice and a dye) and—depending on the mixture you use, the surface of the piece and the composition

of the clay slip—can result in beautiful ferns, trees, stars, etc. The results are never the same and that makes this process very exciting!

Stay tuned for more on this fascinating glazing technique. Let's all give a huge shout out of THANKS to Susan for her research! ~*KS*
