




Books on the Bosque Canceled in 2020

ART TIP: "Fat over Lean"

When painting, remember this simple phrase and many paint errors can be avoided. Problems include paint separation and pooling.

When painting with a water-based medium,* you may paint over it with an oil-based medium, such as tube oil paint or pastel oil sticks.

The reverse procedure is *NOT* true. Never use a water-based medium over a layer of oilbased medium.

* Water-based media include watercolor (pan or tube), gouache, and acrylic paint.
