Rehearsals begin September 7 and are held each Tuesday from 7 to 9 p.m. in the Frazier Performance Hall. Music fee for singers is \$35. Participants are encouraged to be members of BAC, at \$25 level. It's not too late to be a part of this special performance, which served as the very first piece performed by the Chorale in December 2009. The production is dedicated to the memory of Steve Watson, who helped found the Chorale and served as its leader prior to his death in June 2020. 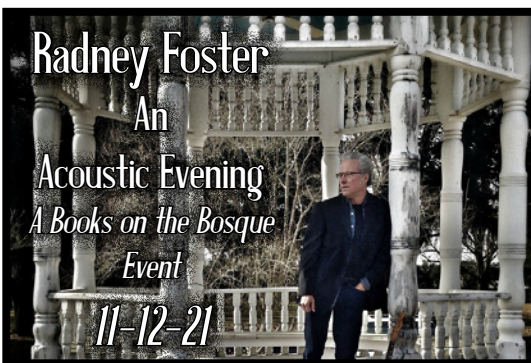
