## TAILGATE BINGO!!

For those who need more space and want to set up their own Tailgate for Bingo, we have 12 parking spots in the "BINGO ZONE." This area provides optimum visibility and hearing for Bingo play. Traffic cones will cordon off the area for those who need to pack in their lawn chairs, flashlights, tables, coolers, lanterns, food, generators/heaters, whatever you need to bring to be comfortable. Bingo cards will be available for purchase on the sidewalk in front of the TBT building and a \$500 jackpot could be waiting for you. Parking spots are by reservation only. There are currently only a few parking spots left. (Call the BAC at 254-675-3724 to reserve.) Regular parking will be outside of the designated BINGO ZONE. Bundle up and join us for an evening of fun!!

Admission price is \$5 per person. Over 40 tables will be set with everything from the elegant to the funny to the minimalistic to much more. Tables celebrate all types of "table" gatherings--birthdays, boys' nights, holidays, pizza parties, pets, or just lovely settings for a gathering of family, friends, and a meal. The BAC will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Saturday, except for Thanksgiving weekend. All attendees will be required to wear a mask and follow viewing instructions, which include maintaining social distancing. We also ask that you do not touch items on the tables for the safety of you and others. Entrance to Tablescapes is through the main front doors and immediately into the theatre. ## Gingerbread Workshop

Gingerbread construction time is almost here! This year we are trying something different. The Gingerbread Workshop will be a Zoom workshop on Sunday, December 6. Our Gingerbread Lady, Kit Myers, will be broadcasting and leading the workshop from her kitchen in San Antonio, just like her very first workshop, back in 1999. Kits with all the items required for building your Gingerbread Village will be available at the BAC for pickup *only* on **Friday, December 4**, for all who have made reservations. Each participant picks up a kit on Friday which contains the gingerbread pieces for a medium house and a tiny house, as well as a cookie for decor and munching. A Styrofoam platform with ample room for building and landscaping your home site, an assortment of prepackaged candies, two icing bags per construction site with 2" cups for sorting your candy, wax paper, and one brown paper bag are also included. Reservations must have been made by November 25, although you may call after that date to see if we have any extra kits. You will receive your Zoom log-in information with your paid reservation. Price for this workshop is \$30, with partial proceeds benefiting the BAC. 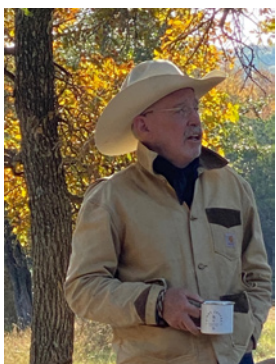

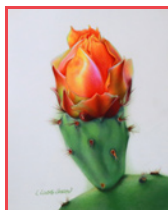

## Art Club News

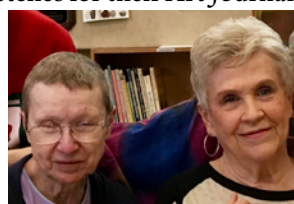

The TBT lost a beloved friend and vital link to its past on Oct. 12 with the passing of Sandra Napieralski. Sandra was a leader in Clifton civic circles when she joined TBT in the mid-1980s. What she intended to be a one-time stage role included a dozen years wearing every hat TBT had to offer. She appeared onstage in numerous comedies, dramas, and melodramas and directed two hit shows for TBT: *Driving Miss Daisy* in 1992 and *Little Old Ladies in Tennis Shoes* in 1995. Sandra and her late husband, Chuck, also helped establish the dinner theatre program at TBT. Sandra served on TBT's Board of Directors many years, including a term as president. While she hadn't been actively involved for two decades, she recalled her time on and off the TBT stage with great affection and maintained lifelong friendships there. May her light shine ever brightly in the hearts of all who knew and loved her. -BD
