



Creating Pencil Paintings Workshop with Brenda Murphy

Are you ready to take pencil and graphite drawing to the next level? Brenda Murphy, known for her

highly realistic and sensitively rendered "pencil paintings," will be conducting a two-day workshop on February 8-9. The focus will be the techniques she uses to create realistic finished drawings. Brenda will conduct a demo and discuss composition, light, edges, value, and the importance of good contrast in graphite drawings. Students will be supplied photo reference and a variety of started drawings to choose from, which they will then work on directly. There will be lots of emphasis on textures, layering, and how to achieve depth with graphite. There will be less emphasis on the drawing process and more emphasis on technique.
