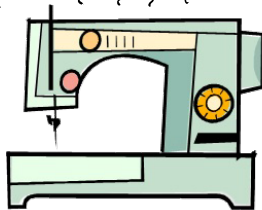

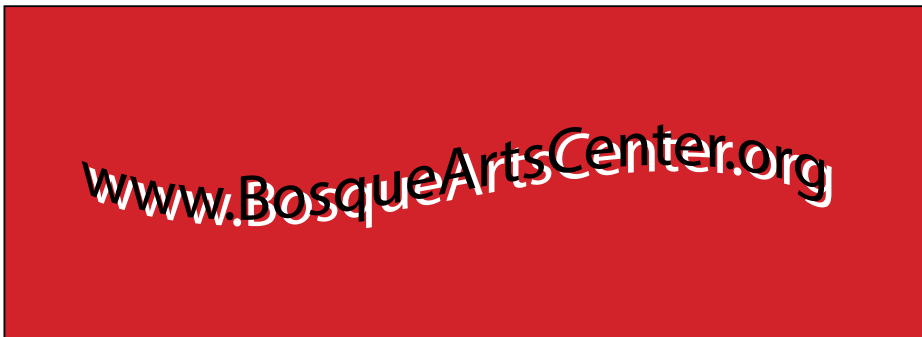

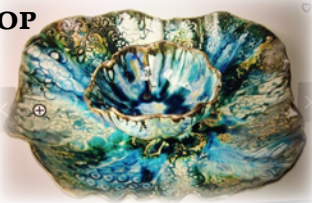


BOSQUE BOOK CLUB

Demonstrator for our July meeting is Megan Morris Major. Her subject will be "Shadows in Your Painting."

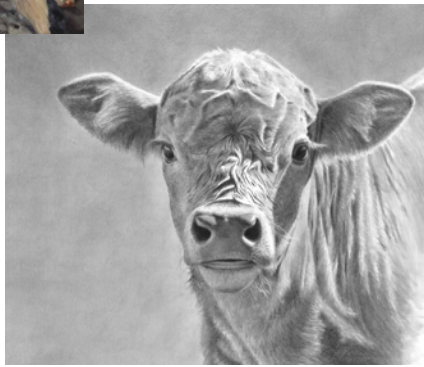

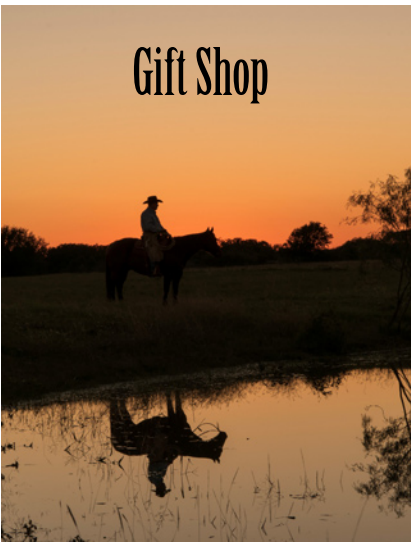
