

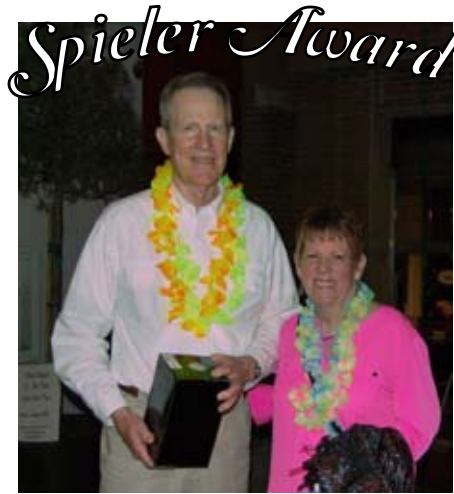

Come see and celebrate the 5th Annual BAC Quilt Show and Competition, Friday and Saturday, June 14 and 15. The quilts are beautiful but they're not the only celebrity at the show; there are quilt vendors, demonstrations, a bed turning, and--new this year--a special workshop. On Friday and Saturday from 3 to 5 pm will be the 2-hour workshop **How to Make a NO-SEW Quilt-styled Christmas Ornament**. You can come observe the workshop either day or purchase a kit for \$25 to participate. The quilt show runs daily from 9 am to 5 pm with featured **hourly demonstrations** including Foundation Paper Piecing on Friday led by Cheryl Lundberg and English Paper Piecing by Bill Calhoon on Saturday. Our **vendors** provide some additional demos, held hourly each day. Be sure to bring your scissors and knives as Hayward Erwin is back again to sharpen your items. Judith Stone will provide a new set of quilts during her **Bed Turning**, in which she provides a variety of interesting information on a series of quilts. Daily admission is \$6 per person and concessions are available till 2 p.m. each day. Jewelry, massage pillows, quilt items, scissor sharpening, and more at the 2019 BAC Quilt Show and Competition. -DP

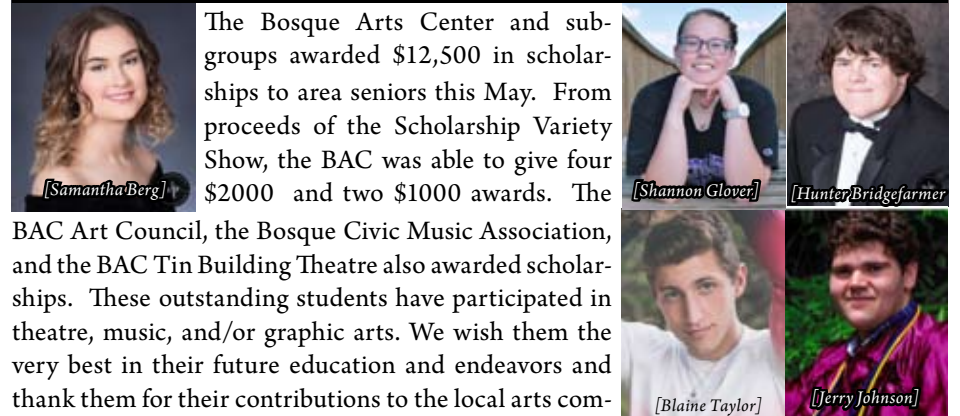

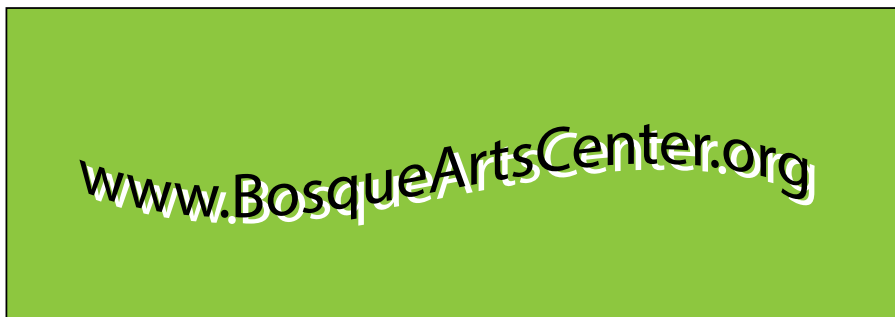

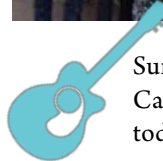

Joan Spieler Lifetime Achievement Award



Rick & Cheryl Lundberg were awarded the Joan Spieler Lifetime Achievement for volunteerism at the 37th Annual Big Event. Actively involved with the Arts Center since the early '80s, Rick is best known for his work as a Clifton CPA and BAC business point man, while Cheryl is known for her involvement throughout BAC over four decades as a volunteer. Rick served one term on the BAC Board of Directors in the 1990s and for more than 20 years prepared BAC tax documents at no charge. Cheryl's early years were spent in active involvement with the Tin Building Theatre, where she served on the TBT Board, including terms as secretary and president, and worked on some 50 productions as actress and director, as well as behind the scenes. Cheryl was also invaluable to the early years of the Big Event in every capacity including three years as Chairperson. She assisted Joan Spieler with the first two Art Classics and served the BAC Board of Directors through much of the 1980s, including a term as board secretary. Cheryl worked toward the creation of the Quilt Guild and has served as president and as chair of each BAC Quilt Show since its inception, donating all materials and piecing for the raffle quilts. She also participates in the annual Tablescapes. The couple are Art Patrons, TBT Patrons, and members of the Bosque Civic Music Association. -BD



Burger & Blues with Van Wilks

Internationally known blues guitarist Van Wilks from Austin will be in concert at the BAC on Saturday, June 29, at 7:00 p.m. for Burgers & Blues. Van Wilks' name is synonymous with the iron muscle of Texas Blues Rock. Van will present a variety of blues with some rock and roll thrown in. A member of the Texas Music Hall of Fame, Wilks has been voted best acoustic and best electric guitarist in the Austin Chronicle's music poll. Touted as "one of Texas' best-kept secrets" and recently named by Billy F. Gibbons (ZZ Top) as one of his major influences, Wilks has shared the stage with some of the world's greats, among them Billy F. Gibbons, Peter Frampton, Lyle Lovett, Christopher Cross, Eric Johnson, Robert Earl Keen, Darryl Jones of the Rolling Stones, Aerosmith, Leon Russell, Journey, and many others. The evening of outstanding music sponsored by the Bosque Civic Music Association will be complete with a delicious burger with all the fixings. Doors open at 6 p.m. Reserved tickets are currently on sale on the BAC website for \$30 which includes burger, beverage, and music! -DJ

TIN BUILDING THEATRE NEWS

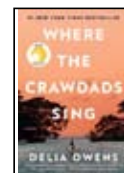
