
TRIBUTE TO BOB SCHAFER

the beneficiaries of this man's generosity and he never sought attention for his giving. What a legacy!" - *Virginia Richards; quote by William Penn*



One of the best-attended workshops for the Art Club has been the making of original greeting cards. Each card is one of a kind. A number of techniques have been demonstrated, including watercolor painting, collage, and marbling. Popular subjects have included nostalgia, Western, seasonal, family, and historical. One reason for the enthusiasm for this workshop is the ease in which these techniques can be used. Common supplies include Strathmore blank greeting cards, vintage photographs, tatting, "tearings" from publications, and multi-colored tissue. Staining by the artist is particularly attractive for the tissue.

It was 20 years ago that TBT was presenting its 30th production. The play was the William Inge classic, Bus Stop, perhaps best remembered for the 1956 Marilyn Monroe film version. The local stage was transformed into a Kansas bus stop where a gathering of interesting misfits are stranded during a blinding snowstorm. The play was directed by the late Clifton Police Chief Jim Vanderhoof. The play ran for several performances in September and October 1991.
