





Wortham began his writing career when he was in the fifth grade; however, his work did not truly progress until nearly 25 years later.

Mr. Wortham taught middle school for eight years and high school for two in the Garland Independent School District. He continued his education, receiving a Superintendent's Certificate before deciding that was not where he wanted to spend the rest of his career.

The Rock Hole, his first novel, was a finalist in the prestigious Benjamin Franklin Award presented by the Independent Book Publishers Association, and a finalist for the Will Rogers Medallion.

Currently, Mr. Wortham has joined the Kensington Publishing family with his new Sonny Hawke thriller series. This contemporary thriller features Texas Ranger Sonny Hawke in a fictional West Texas town based on Marfa, Texas.

When not writing Reavis is an avid outdoorsman who enjoys travel, camping, canoeing, hunting, and fishing.




Bosque Civic Music Association






The 33rd Annual Bosque Art Classic

Kathy Tate of Stephenville, TX, walked away with the John Steven Jones Purchase Award on opening night of the $33^{\rm rd}$ Annual Bosque Art Classic on September 8, 2018. Tate also took home the Silver Medal for Oil/Acrylic, winning both awards for her oil Once Someone's Dream.

Jeff Rechin of Amissville, VA, won the Art Patrons Purchase Award and Gold Medal Sculpture for his sculpture Spring.

The Boren- Selvidge Award went to Sarah Webber of Jackson, WY, for



her piece, An Old Friend, while Brenda Driggers of Cleburne garnered the New Entrant Award for *Anni*, a watercolor.

I The national art show and sale—sponsored by the BAC Art Council and judged this year by Cowboy Artists of America member Jason Rich-drew a crowd of around 300 artists and

art-lovers to the Bosque Arts Center. The exhibit remained open to the public through September 22, displaying 174 pieces of outstanding artwork selected from the original 754 digital entries. B

Kathy Tate's husband Johnny had, in his childhood, milked cows in the barn that served as inspiration for Kathy's award-winning oil.

"I've driven by that barn for years and always felt it was 'paint worthy' but it had always been mowed around and well kept ...this time, it was showing

its age and the neglect gave it lots to say. "Every dairyman or farmer that I know always thinks that 'next year' they'll

finally 'get ahead' ... their dream of doing what they love and actually making a profit. Whoever built that barn had big dreams of raising a family and making a good living by milking cows in that little barn. It was 'once someone's dream.'

"I love still life but also love architecture. I enjoy bringing back memories of grandmothers canning fruit or making jelly; I love how light hits objects and the way it bounces and reflects ...sort of like a dance of light and color. Old structures have so much to say...so many memories of families, births, deaths, good years and bad. Sad to see them crum-



ble away or be pushed down to make room for more modern structures."

A sixth-generation Texan, Kathy says winning the Jones Award "was a complete shock and surprise. When I walked into the gallery and saw my work on the Jones award wall, my first thought was that they had moved the Jones award to a different wall...I think I muttered something like 'what's my painting doing there?' When Joyce Jones told her she had won, Kathy says she "went into shock at that moment! Like a dream come true!" ψ

Art Patrons Purchase Award winner Jeff Rechin is recognized as one of the preeminent sculptors of wildfowl art in the United States. His work that can be found in private collections throughout the United States and Great Britain includes reproductions of original works designed exclusively for the Danbury Mint.

"I am totally drawn to warblers which lent itself to some good ideas for habitat.

The grape vine setup for this worked perfect to give height to the piece, with the male at the top and the female below. Basically it's a piece depicting courtship after a long migration to the northeastern United Sates.

"I work in wood but the design aspects of my pieces are worked out in clay. I started carving wood at a young age and have always been drawn to wood's ability to hold fine details. I prefer acrylic over oil paints, because of their vibrant color and fast drying quality."

Jeff says winning the Art Patrons Purchase Award "was totally unexpected in a good way, which made the news really exciting. It is quite an honor.

"Unfortunately I wasn't able to attend, but from what I was able to see online it's a high quality show which I'm glad to be a part of. What has made this show special is to be involved with other artwork of such high caliber."






